Increased investment in “People”

- EC goal within FP7 (2007-2013):
 - to stimulate collaboration, excellence and competences in Europe
- Marie Curie Activities within Specific Programme People - **4,5 billion EURO for 7 years**

(in FP6 1,8 billion EURO for 4 years)
- **Expected more than 70 000 researchers to be funded**

Objectives of People Programme

- **Overall strategic objective:**

- to make Europe more attractive for researchers

- **Objectives:**

- strengthen, quantitatively and qualitatively, the human potential in research and technology in Europe
- stimulate people to take up the profession of a researcher
- encourage European researchers to stay in Europe
- attract to Europe the best researchers from the entire World

- **How:**

- ensure researchers skills and competence development at all stages of their careers
- support sustainable career development and life-long learning of researchers
- enhance mobility, both trans-national and intersectoral

People programme as a tool for EU policy for career and mobility of researchers

- European Mobility strategy (2001) - ‘brain circulation’ – in the benefit of economy and society in Europe
- Europe 2020 Strategy and flagship initiatives:
 - Innovation Union (IAPP)
 - Youth On the Move (COFUND)
 - Agenda for new skills and jobs (ITN, IAPP)

Specificities of People programme

- **Quality of doctoral training** - European Industrial Doctorates, Innovative Doctoral Programmes, Initial Training of Researchers
- **Involvement of industry, including SMEs** - Inter-sector mobility of researchers within IAPP and ITN
- **Attractive employment conditions and gender balance in research careers** – based on European Charter for Researchers and Code of Conduct for their Recruitment
- **Leveraging national policies and programmes** – COFUND
- **Knowledge sharing, dissemination and open access** - enhance dissemination and outreach activities in IEF, IIF, IOF and CIG
- **International cooperation** - most Marie Curie Actions are open to researchers from all nationalities

Main definitions

- **Early-stage researchers** – less than 4 years research experience (full-time equivalent) or not completed PhD at the time of recruitment or secondment
- **Experienced researchers** - more than 4 years research experience (full-time equivalent) or completed PhD at the time of recruitment or secondment
- **Third countries** - countries which are neither EU Member States nor third countries associated to FP7

FP7 participating countries

- **27 EU Member States (MS)**
- **Associated Countries (AC)**
- a) Switzerland, Israel, Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein, Turkey, Croatia, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Serbia, Albania, Montenegro, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Faroe Islands, Republic of Moldova

- **Third countries**
 - **International Cooperation Partner Countries (ICPC):**
low-income, lower-middle-income or upper-middle-income countries
 - **Other (non-AC, non-ICPC) Third countries (OTC)**
USA, Canada, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, etc. – high developed countries participating in FP7 with own funding

5. Specific Policy Actions	around 1%

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Activity 4: World Fellowships

- Main objectives:
 - strengthen and enrich international cooperation through researchers
 - attract research talent to Europe
 - strengthen cooperation between European research organisations and research organisations of countries with which the EU has concluded Science and Technology agreements and European neighbourhood countries

Activity 4: World Fellowships

- Career development / long-term training of EU researchers
 - MC outgoing fellowships (IOF) with obligatory return phase
 - Career integration grants for European researchers (CIG)
- International collaboration with Third countries
 - All Marie Curie activities open to Third countries host organizations
 - MC incoming fellowships (IIF) for researchers coming to Europe for knowledge transfer
 - Support for researchers exchange (IRSES)

Marie Curie International Incoming Fellowships (IIF)

Main objectives:

- reinforce the research excellence of Europe through knowledge sharing with incoming **top-class researchers**
- develop mutually beneficial research co-operation between Europe and a third country
- enhance the possibility of future collaborative research links of the fellow with European researchers and organisations

Marie Curie International Incoming Fellowships (IIF)

- Main characteristics
 - Only for **experienced researcher** possessing PhD or at least 4 years research experience
 - Open to third country researchers going to host in EU MS or AC
 - Length of the fellowship - **12 – 24 months**
 - Possible **Return Phase** (1 year) for researchers from International Cooperation Partnership Countries (ICPC)

Marie Curie International Incoming Fellowships (IIF)

- **Main activities:**
- *Transfer of knowledge activities*
 - Research and Transfer of Technologies – to widen significantly the competences of the *host organisation*
 - Research activities - of strong interest for the ERA, to create long term mutually beneficial co-operation
 - Return phase (one year) - share experience in ICPC
- *Outreach Activities* - dissemination directed to general public (press articles, scientific café, target students, etc.)

Marie Curie International Incoming Fellowships (IIF)

- **Funding:**

- monthly living allowance (87 500 EUR per year)
- mobility allowance (1000 or 700 EUR monthly)
- contribution to the participation expenses of the fellow (800 EUR per RM)
- Contribution to overheads (700 EUR per RM)
- Return phase
(15 000 EUR for 1 year)

Marie Curie International Outgoing Fellowships (IOF)

- **Main objectives:**
 - reinforce the international dimension of the career of European researchers
 - provide researchers opportunity to be **trained and acquire new knowledge** in a high-level organisation in a Third country
 - transfer the acquired knowledge and experience during the return phase

Marie Curie International Outgoing Fellowships (IOF)

- Main characteristics
 - Only for **experienced researcher** possessing PhD or at least 4 years research experience
 - Researchers from EU MS or AC which had no activities in the host country for more than 12 months in the last 3 years
 - Open to third country researchers residing more than 5 years in EU MS or AC
 - Length of the fellowship - **12 – 36 months**
 - 1 year mandatory **reintegration phase**

Marie Curie International Outgoing Fellowships (IOF)

- **Main activities:**
 - training-through-research by means of an individual personalised project
 - training activities for developing scientific (new techniques or instruments, etc.) and complementary skills (proposal preparation to request funding, patent applications, project management, task coordination, technical staff supervision, etc.)
 - inter-sectoral or interdisciplinary transfer of knowledge
 - scientific and financial management of the research project
 - organisation of training or dissemination events
- **Personal Career Development Plan** - to monitor researchers' progress

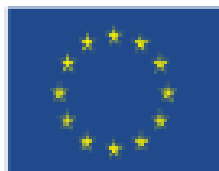

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International Research Staff Exchange Scheme (IRSES)

- Main objectives
 - strengthen research partnerships through staff exchanges and networking activities between European research organisations and research organisations from Third countries
 - with which the EU has an S&T agreement: *Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Chile, Egypt, India, Japan, (Rep. of) Korea, Mexico, Morocco, New Zealand, Russia, South Africa, Tunisia, Ukraine, United States*
 - or countries covered by the European Neighborhood policy: *Armenia, Azerbaijan, **Belarus**, Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine, Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Palestinian-administrated areas, Syrian Arab Rep., Tunisia*
 - support research organisations to establish or reinforce long-term research cooperation through a coordinated joint programme of exchange of researchers for short periods

International Research Staff Exchange Scheme (IRSES)

- **minimum 3 participants**: two from EU MS or AC and one from Third country
- Coordinator: from EU MS or AC
- Length of the project: **2-4 years**
- **balanced exchange** of researchers between the European and the third country partner organisations, each funding the mobility costs of their seconded staff members
- maximum duration of the individual staff exchanges (researchers or technical/managerial staff) - **12 months** (possible splits)
- **joint multi-annual programme** for the exchange of staff between the project participants
- mandatory **Partnership agreement** between partners

International Research Staff Exchange Scheme (IRSES)

- **Possible activities:**
 - joint research and training
 - joint workshops and seminars
 - other networking activities
- **Aim of activities:**
- exploit complementary expertise of participants and create synergies between them
- achieve scientific results and transfer knowledge
- generate a basis for sustainable cooperation

International Research Staff Exchange Scheme (IRSES)

- Funding:
 - 1900 EUR flat rate for 1 month secondment
 - additional long distance allowance of 200 EUR per seconded MS/AC staff member per month
 - countries covered by the European Neighbourhood Policy (ENP) or with EU International S&T agreements - eligible for funding for incoming (if requested) and outgoing staff members
 - EU contribution will be administered by MS or AC
