What are the Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions?

A European Union funded programme for structuring researcher training, mobility and career development

Objectives

Ensure the optimum development and dynamic use of Europe's intellectual capital in order to

generate new skills, knowledge and innovation

Budget 2014-2020: € 6.162 billion



What do the MSCA offer you?

- Prestigious career opportunities
- Excellent working conditions: employment contracts, full social security etc.
- Very competitive salaries
- Opportunities to work and train with the best researchers in Europe and worldwide
- Whole career training: complementary skills
- Access to top level conferences, professional associations & Marie Curie Alumni



Who, what and where?

- Who: All levels of research experience from PhD researcher upwards there are actions for different levels of experience.
- What: All areas of research are supported: bottom-up approach
- Where: Anywhere: any research performing organisation, public or private worldwide - there are actions for European and international mobility.



Some Marie Curie Actions facts & figures:

- Since 1996, more than 80,000 researchers of 100 different nationalities working in 70 countries supported.
- Nearly 6 300 universities, research organisations and companies worldwide have participated since 2007.
- The countries hosting the highest number of Marie Curie researchers:
 - United Kingdom,
 - Germany,
 - France,
 - Spain,
 - the Netherlands
 - Italy
- The total number of Marie Curie researchers supported to date is expected to hit 90,000 by the end of 2013.



How are the MSCA structured?

- ITN: Innovative Training Networks: support for doctoral and early-stage training
 - Researchers supported apply to a project
- IF: Individual Fellowships: support for experienced researchers undertaking international mobility
 - Researchers supported apply to directly to a call for proposals



...How are the MSCA structured?

- RISE: International and inter-sector cooperation through the exchange of staff
 - Researchers supported are already in the institutions
- COFUND: co-funding of regional, national and international doctoral and fellowship programmes
 - Researchers supported apply to a call cofunded by the MSCA




Which actions are suited for me?



Depends on experience and type of mobility





Support for two categories of researchers:

Early Stage Researcher: Less than 4 years of research experience*, and without a doctoral degree (pre-doc)

Experienced Researcher: In possession of a doctoral degree or at least 4 years of research experience* (postdoc)

*counted from the time when the individual is entitled to embark on a doctoral degree

All scientific and technological fields are supported!





Support for two types of mobility:

European: based in Europe for fellowship, ie: moving within Europe or from outside Europe into Europe (Belarus researchers)

Global: based in an institution outside of Europe, ie: moving from Europe to a country outside of Europe NB compulsory return phase of one year (fully funded)



2 ways to be supported:

Apply for your own fellowship

or

Apply to a project



1. Apply for your own fellowship

Directly to the Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions → Post Doc level only



Individual Fellowships

Post-doctoral fellowships for outstanding researchers

For experienced researchers

- In possession of a doctoral degree, or have 4 years of full-time research experience at the time of the call deadline
- Two types depending on the mobility of the researcher

Within Europe - European Fellowships

Outside Europe - Global Fellowships



Objective

- enhance the creative and innovative potential of experienced researchers
- provide opportunities to acquire new knowledge, work on research projects in a European context or outside Europe, resume a career or return to Europe

Scope

- Individual, trans-national fellowships awarded to the best or most promising researchers
- Career Restart Panel and Reintegration Panel



IF Main Features:

- Budget: € 240.50m in 2014 (Global Fellowships: €29m) and € 213m in 2015 (Global Fellowships: €m)
- Duration of projects: 2 years (Global Fellowships: 3 years)
- Focus on career development, not necessarily experience
- Additional 3 or 6 month secondment option in Europe and in another sector
- Separate multidisciplinary panels for Career Restart and Reintegration



European Fellowships Researchers:

- International mobility within or into Member States (MS) and Associated Countries (AC)
- Experienced researchers of any nationality
- Applicants must not have resided or carried out their main activity in the country of the host organisation for more then 12 months in the 3 years immediately prior to the call deadline



Global Fellowships Researchers:

- International mobility from Member States (MS) and Associated Countries (AC) to a third country and return
- Support to experienced researchers of any nationality: nationals of EU countries and long-term residents
- Applicants must comply with the rules for mobility:
 - Must not have resided or carried out their main activity in the country of the 3rd country organisation for more than 12 months in the 3 years immediately prior to the call deadline



IF Financial Aspects



Monthly Living Allowance

- €4,650 gross monthly salary (€55,800 annually) corrected for the cost of living in the country

Mobility Allowance

- €600 per month

Family Allowance

- €500 per month for researchers married/legally partnered or with dependant children

Contribution to Research, training and Transfer of Knowledge

- €800 per month

Overheads and management

- €650 per researcher month

1. Apply for your own fellowship

To a cofunded call for proposals

→ currently Post Doc level only
 → 2015 onwards – post doc and predoc



Cofunding of regional, national and international doctoral and fellowship programmes

Why: to stimulate regional, national or international programmes to foster excellence in researchers' training, mobility and career development

- Opportunities for researchers from all countries
- Researchers comply with the mobility rules of the MSCA
- Open and transparent: calls/vacancies widely publicised



How to apply for a fellowship:

- Known calls are always listed on the Marie Curie Website
- Future calls must be advertised there also
- Eligibility depends on the call consult the documentation carefully
- Funding levels depend on the call but are within a range pre-approved by the MSCA

limited opportunities for first post doc also



Innovative Training Networks

Research training for PhD & (some) first PostDoc

- transnational network in multi/interdisciplinary and emerging fields
- training primarily through research on individual, personalised research projects
- complemented by substantial training modules in key transferable skills
- Strong involvement of commercial entities in training



Features

- Consortium applies to MSCA for funding; consortium then recruits the researchers
 - leading networks of European and international researchers
- 3 year PhD training
- Max 24 months for post docs
- Employment contracts with full social security
- Researchers enjoy same rights as fellows that apply directly to MSCA for a post-doc



How to apply for a fellowship


- All projects publish their vacancies on the Marie Curie website + on NatureJobs
- Eligibility criteria depend only on level of research experience and mobility
- Funding levels defined by the MSCA: gross monthly amounts: €3110 living allowance (corrected for the cost of living in the country) + €600 mobility allowance + €500 family allowance where applicable

Who can be an expert?

You have a chance of being selected as an expert if you:

- · have high-level of expertise in the relevant fields of research and innovation (see call for details on types of expertise).
- · can be available for occasional, short-term assignments

REGISTER AS EXPERT

What do expert assignments involve?

Experts, as peer reviewers, assist in the:

- evaluation of proposals
- monitoring of actions

In addition, experts assist in the :

 preparation, implementation or evaluation of programmes and design of policies.
