



## **Cooperation**

The core of FP7, representing two thirds of the overall budget, fosters collaborative research across Europe and other partner countries through projects by transnational consortia of industry and academia. Research will be carried out in ten key thematic areas









Supports "frontier research" to be carried out in any area of science or technology, including engineering, socio-economic sciences and the humanities. Bottom-up approach.

No obligation for cross-border partnerships: projects are implemented by "individual teams" around a "principal investigator".

The programme is implemented via the European Research Council (ERC).







Provides support for researcher mobility and career development, both for researchers inside the European Union and internationally. It is implemented via a set of Marie Curie actions, providing fellowships and other measures to help researchers build their skills and competences throughout their careers.








Strengthens the research capacities that Europe needs to become a thriving knowledge-based economy. Activities:

The European Commission will appoint independent experts to assist with evaluations, considering their skills and knowledge . *Registration of Experts:* https://cordis.europa.eu/emmfp7/





- Support competitiveness through strategic partnerships with third countries in selected fields of science
- Address specific problems facing third countries on the basis of mutual interest and mutual benefit
- Use S&T cooperation to reinforce the Community's external relations and other relevant policy





### **International Cooperation**

- Third Countries:
- Industrialised countries
- **Associated and Candidate countries**
- International Cooperation Partner Countries (ICPC):
- ACP, Asia, Eastern European and Central Asian countries, Latin America, Mediterranean partner Countries, Western Balkan countries





**Cooperation – Collaborative research** 

- Two ways for 3<sup>rd</sup> Countries to participate:
- Opening <u>all</u> Themes to 3<sup>rd</sup> countries
- Specific International Cooperation Actions within each Theme





**Cooperation – Collaborative research** 

Opening of all themes to third countries

- Minimum 3 <u>different</u> EU Member State (MS) or Associated countries (AC)
- Beyond this minimum, all 3<sup>rd</sup> countries can participate
- ICPC would generally be funded
- Industrialised countries funded only if indispensable for the project



### **Cooperation – Collaborative research**

Specific International Cooperation Actions

EUROPEAN

- Calls for proposals dedicated to ICPC in each theme (needs and potential)
- Minimum 4 participants from <u>different</u> countries: 2 ICPC + 2 MS or AC







To reinforce excellence, dynamism and creativity in European research and improve the attractiveness of Europe for the best researchers from both European and third countries, as well as for industrial research investment, by providing a Europe-wide competitive funding structure, in addition to and not replacing national funding, for 'frontier research'

### **People – Fellowships**

### For European Researchers

- Outgoing fellowships with mandatory return
- Return/reintegration of European researchers abroad

### For 3<sup>rd</sup> Country Researchers

- Host-Driven actions for 3<sup>rd</sup> country researchers
- Incoming individual fellowships
- Schemes for Neighbouring countries and those with S&T agreement
- Scientific "Diaspora" of Europeans abroad and foreigners in Europe





Coordination of the international cooperation actions under the different programmes and across Themes

Aim :


To strengthen overall coordination to ensure a coherent approach and develop synergies with other Community policies (RELEX, DEV, Trade, ENV...)





### S&T agreements

- 31 Agreements with 20 countries
- 16 EC + 15 Euratom
- EC: 4 industrialised, 5 emerging, 7 developing
- Geography:
  - 2 Eastern Europe (Russia, Ukraine)
  - 3 Mediterranean (Egypt, Morocco, Tunisia)
  - 1 Sub-Saharan Africa (South Africa)
  - 3 Asia (China, India, South Korea)
  - 2 North America (Canada, USA)
  - 4 Latin America (Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Mexico)
  - 1 Oceania (Australia)
- In the pipeline: Japan, Jordan, New Zealand







**Transnational Cooperation among NCPs :** 

- Reinforcing the network of NCPs for International Cooperation activities by promoting trans-national cooperation;
- Activities include benchmarking, joint workshops and training, twinning schemes, brokerage events etc...
- All NCPs appointed should be involved, unless detailed reasons are provided for the non-participation of specific NCPs

INCO-NETs are platforms bringing together policy makers and stakeholders of one target region/country with the EU to:

Establish a dialogue to identify S&T priorities for mutual benefit and interest and define cooperation policy orientations;

Implement specific activities to promote and contribute to the participation of the targeted regions/countries in the Framework Programme





### **INCO-NET:** Bi-regional policy dialogue

- Bi-regional policy dialogue for mapping research needs and setting S&T cooperation priorities;
- Strengthening co-ordination and complementarities with activities carried out by means of Community foreign policy instruments;
- Identification of areas with potential for enhanced coordination between and with the Member States, the Associated States and International Cooperation Partner Countries.

COMMISSION CAPACITIES - International Cooperation

**INCO-NET: Implementation activities** 

2007 Call: 17 M€

- Developing, promoting, organising and structuring the participation of third countries in FP;
- Setting regional networks/fora with all relevant stakeholders;
- Training, awareness actions and dissemination activities;
- Evaluation and monitoring of ongoing cooperation activities.

### **Bilateral S&T Cooperation Partnerships (BILAT)**:

**Objective:** 

Strengthen the cooperation partnership between the EU and countries which have an S&T cooperation agreement or are in the process of negotiating one.



CAPACITIES - International Cooperation BILAT actions:

- Improve the exchange of information on programs and funding between Europe and third countries;
- Develop national information platforms;
- Promotion and awareness activities;
- Joint fora for cooperation

EUROPEAN

Assistance in forming research partnerships; etc...





### CAPACITIES - International Cooperation BILAT Call - Implementation

Call identifier: FP7-INCO-2007-2

Call publication date: 15/06/07

Call closure date: 11/09/07 Indicative budget: 6.4 M€

Funding scheme: Coordination and support action (CSA-SA), typ 0.5 M€ for 3 years

→13 projects selected for funding (negotiation to start in February 2008)





### CAPACITIES - International Cooperation BILAT - Results

- ACP: South Africa
- ASIA: China, India
- **EECA:** Russia, Ukraine
- LAM: Brazil, Chile, Mexico
- MPC: Morocco, Tunisia

Industrialised Countries: Australia, Korea, New-Zealand





<u>Coordination of national policies and</u> <u>activities on international S&T cooperation</u> (ERA-NET):

**Objective:** 

To increase the cooperation and coordination of research programmes carried out at national or regional level in the MS and AS and which target one third country or several third countries in a given region





All participants should be either:

- programme owners, such as national ministries or regional authorities managing a research programme
- programme managers (e.g. research councils, agencies) which implement research programmes under programme owners' supervision
- in justified cases: programme owners without a research programme but planning to set up one

Participants from at least 3 different MS or AC



Provide an incentive to organise joint calls for proposals between national and/or regional research programmes. Actions shall cover subjects which have sufficient European added value, whereby:

- One joint call to be implemented per ERA-NET Plus proposal
- Joint evaluation of proposals, based on international peer review
- Only transnational projects can be financed out of the joint call

Rules of 5 :

- Min 5 participants of 5 different MS or AC,
- Maximum duration of 5 years

Max. Community contribution 1/3 of the total joint call budget composed of:

- small part for call management (eligible cost) and
- the bulk of the 1/3 to top up joint call budget

Call closure date: 12/02/08

Indicative budget: 11 M€

#### Preparatory ERA-NET (FP7-INCO-2007-3.1.1)

coordination and support action (CSA-SA), typ. 300 k€ for 2 years)

#### ERA-NET (FP7-INCO-2007-3.1.2)

coordination and support action (CSA-CA), typ. 3 M€ for 4 years)

#### ERA-NET Plus (FP7-INCO-2007-3.2)

The combined national/regional and Community contributions to the joint calls would normally exceed 5 million € but should never be less than 3 million €
